School Sports and Extracurricular Activities Travel

Restrictions on travel for sport and extracurricular activities are being lifted as of Friday, <u>October 22, 2021</u>. Teams and extracurricular groups will be permitted to travel within New Brunswick. This includes travel in and out of circuit breaker communities under the Mandatory Order.

Students under the age of 12

All restrictions on the participation of students under the age of 12 in circuit breaker communities in school sports and extracurricular activities are being lifted as of Friday, October 22, 2021.

Spectators

Outside the school buildings

Spectators will have access to facilities outside of school buildings, such as outdoor sports fields and facilities. Spectators will also have access to both indoor and outdoor community facilities, provided they follow any rules or requirements set out for that facility. In addition, entrances must be monitored to ensure spectators for both indoor and outdoor events have received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. Masking and physical distancing will be required at all times.

Parent and/or community volunteers will be essential to support schools in event supervision. If schools are not able to secure such support, schools and school districts may individually choose to not allow spectators.

School principals have the authority to prohibit spectators at future events if spectators are uncooperative and not respecting guidelines.

Inside the school buildings

Schools and school districts will be asked to develop plans to outline how they will operationalize the vaccination, masking and physical distancing requirements for spectators to attend sports or extracurricular activities within school buildings effective October 29, 2021.
