SUMMER SCHOOL 2022 for GRADE 8

The pandemic has made the past school year stressful and the transition to high school more difficult for grade 8. **This year summer school will again be offered to grade 8 students.** We recommend Summer School as an important opportunity for them to experience success. The RAND Foundation's report, "Making Summer Count", found 13 research papers on summer schools that showed the following benefits for grades 8 students:

- Students who do not have a good background as they move to high school become increasingly frustrated and can fall even further behind if additional time is not provided.
- Summer school gives the student an **opportunity to feel more confident and experience some success** in the subject before the next school year.
- Students who attend summer school have better outcomes than similar peers who do not attend these programs.
- Summer programs can reverse summer learning loss, achieve learning gains, give low-performing students the chance to master material that they did not learn during the previous school year and propel students toward higher achievement.
- "Almost all students can master material if given enough time and proper instruction."

SUMMER SCHOOL 2022 GRADE 9 – 12 GUIDE FOR STUDENTS, PARENTS & TEACHERS

This summer regular in person summer school classes will be offered at **Harrison Trimble High School**.

Students should attend summer school if they:

- <u>Failed</u> a course that is a prerequisite to one required next year, for example, failing grade 9, 10 or 11 Math or English; or a course required for graduation or admission to university and community college programs.
- <u>Need to Improve</u> their mark. Nearly all university and community college programs require more than a passing grade. For example, in 14 of the 18 programs offered at UNB the minimum requirement is a mark of 75 on a list of high school courses. Marks below 70 in key courses are often not accepted. Universities and colleges warn students "seats are limited so meeting minimum requirements will not guarantee admission."

High School Courses Offered

English 9,10,11,12, Math 9, Numbers 10, Geometry 10, Foundations 11, Finance 11, 12, Pre-Calculus 11, Pre-Calculus 12, Biology 11,12, Chemistry 11,12, History 11, Social Studies 9,10, Science 9,10. A class may not be offered because of insufficient numbers and some classes may fill so register early.

Students can take any course they took in a past school year if the final mark was over 40. If under 40, they need the permission of a Principal or Vice-Principal.

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
